As we launch into a new year at Seminole State College, I find myself constantly reminded of our students and employees' abilities to persevere, adapt, and overcome obstacles. 2021 was another challenging year. Many of us experienced loss. Many of us faced economic hardship. Many of us saw career changes. Despite these difficulties, we've seen the campus community come together for food drives and veterans' appreciation projects. STORIES OF THE YEAR

COLLEGE CLEARS OUTSTANDING BALANCES ON STUDENT ACCOUNTS



Seminole State College cleared the outstanding balance on more than 660 student accounts through direct scholarships. This move was made possible through the Higher Education Emergency Relief Fund II (HEERF II) monies the College received to offset financial difficulties created by the COVID-19 pandemic. The College committed \$715,000 of these federal funds to clear account balances students incurred for tuition and fees during the pandemic.

No action was required on the part of students. The scholarships were automatically applied to student accounts.

"We understand that the pandemic presented many challenges that prevented a lot of students from achieving their educational goals. We sincerely hope that this will lift some of the burden put on them by the pandemic and that students will return to SSC to finish their degree," President Lana Reynolds said.

SSC EXPANDS VIRTUAL OPTIONS FOR STUDENTS



The year began with SSC making online learning more accessible to students with the launch of its Laptop Loan Program. Later in the spring, the College held a ribbon-cutting ceremony for the virtual learning lounge, a space designed for students to student and connect to online instruction. In the summer, the Online Degree Office was created, launching with three fully online degree programs. Throughout the remainder of the year, the online degree programs would expand to 13, including an LPN to RN option.

JANUARY

Belles Basketball Celebrates 50th Season

In 1971, the Blue Bell sewing plant donated \$10,000 to start a women's basketball program at then Seminole Junior College. This was one year before Title IX was mandated, ensuring young women the right to participate in collegiate athletics. Fifty years later, the 2020-21 squad celebrated half a century of Belles' basketball. In honor of the Belles' original colors, the team wore commemorative Columbia blue jerseys for the season.

Wrangler/Kontoor Makes Donation to SSC Food Pantry

Employees from Wrangler/Kontoor made a large donation of canned and other non-perishable food items to the Seminole State College Food Pantry. Members of the company's Distribution Center Activities Committee organized the canned food drives for the SSC Food Pantry and Seminole's community Interfaith Food Pantry.

PLC Celebrates Martin Luther King Day

Members of the Seminole State College President's Leadership class met to commemorate Martin Luther King Day. The group watched "The Green Book," a film based on a true story about an African American pianist, who embarks on a concert tour in the Deep South in 1962. President Lana Reynolds led a discussion with the group following the screening.



SSC Launches Laptop Loan Program

Seminole State College's Boren Library launched a new laptop loan program to assist students with their technology needs. With a growing number of students enrolling in online or hybrid courses due to the COVID-19 pandemic, the College wanted to offer the program to remove a financial barrier that students may face.

SSC Board of Regents Renews President's Contract

The Seminole State College Board of Regents met Jan. 21 to consider a recommendation to hire a professional auditing service and to review the terms of President Lana Reynolds' employment. President Reynolds contract was renewed, with Chair Curtis Morgan noting that President Reynolds declined a salary increase, given that the College was unable to provide a raise to faculty and staff last summer when employee contracts were renewed.

SSC Employees Recognized at Statewide Conference

Two Seminole State College employees were honored at the 53rd annual Oklahoma Association of Community Colleges Conference, held virtually this year on Jan. 29. Gateway to Prevention and Recovery Donates NARCAN Kits to SSC

Gateway to Prevention and Recovery donated 10 NARCAN drug overdose response kits Seminole State College. NARCAN is a nasal spray containing the medication naloxone. The kits are designed to rapidly reverse opioid overdose.

Morgan Named to SSC Rural Business Center Position

The Seminole State College Educational Foundation announced the hiring of former State Representative Danny Morgan to direct the SSC Rural Business and Resources Center (RBRC). The Center, established in 2004, is funded through the Oklahoma Department of Commerce to provide economic development assistance in the College's five-county service area.



Great Western Dining Honored by Chamber of Commerce

Seminole State College Food Service company, Great Western Dining, was honored by the Seminole Chamber of Commerce with an annual Director's Award in recognition of efforts to safely serve meals at the Chamber Forum and other community events during 2020.

Repair Efforts Undertaken at SSC Following Winter Storm

Seminole State College experienced an extensive amount of damage across its campus due to a winter storm in mid-February. Flooding due to frozen and busted water pipes occurred in several classroom buildings and a resident hall. A number of science labs and classrooms were flooded on south end of the Tanner Hall, resulting in approximately one-third of the campus' largest classroom building to be closed for repair.

SSC Upward Bound Students Visit New York

AUGUST

Talent Search Program Awarded \$3.3 Million in Federal Grants

The U.S. Department of Education awarded the Seminole State College Talent Search Program two grants totaling approximately \$3,329,000. The grant application process was spearheaded by Talent Search Director Mary Ann Hill. The Talent Search Program identifies qualified high school and middle school students with potential for education at the postsecondary level and encourages them to complete high school and pursue higher education opportunities.

SSC and SSM Health St. Anthony Hospital – Shawnee Partnership Honored

Seminole State College and SSM Health St. Anthony Hospital - Shawnee were recognized by the Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education with a Business Partnership Excellence Award. The award program annually honors outstanding partnerships that lead to significant contributions in educating and developing Oklahoma's workforce.



SSC to Offer LPN to RN Online Degree Program Seminole State College Nursing received approval from the Oklahoma Board of Nursing to start a new LPN to RN online option. The SSC Nursing Program hoped to launch the on-

line course in November. Students will need to complete five online nursing courses to complete their degree. The program will take approximately 10 months to complete.
