Employment Readiness: Director Jerry Fry

Establishes a partnership between the Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education (OSRHE) and Oklahoma Human Services (OKDHS). The design centers on providing post-secondary short-term education opportunities for both clients in the TANF WORK program and Work Ready Oklahoma (WRO) participants with a child under the age of 18. The primary education driver will be workforce-focused short-term offerings, micro-credentials, and certificate programs at institutions of higher education.

GEAR UP: Director Jonathan Bennett

(Gaining Early Awareness and Readiness for Undergraduate Programs)

Designed to increase the number of students who are prepared to enter and succeed in postsecondary education. GEAR UP provides six-year or seven years grants to states and partnerships to provide services at high-poverty middle and high schools. GEAR UP grantees serve an entire cohort of students beginning no later than the seventh grade and following the cohort through high school. Schools served – Asher, Holdenville, Konawa, Maud, Moss, Okemah, Seminole, Strother, Tecumseh, Varnum, Wetumka, Wewoka.

(Native American Serving Non-Tribal Institutions)

A Title III Strengthening Institutions grant designed to improve retention and graduation rates of atrisk SSC students through the implementation of transformative learning strategies and classrooms, a Student Engagement Center with new engagement services such as coaching and mentoring, and by revision of 19 high-risk courses.
