# **Concurrent enrollment financial** assistance available to sophomore students beginning the summer of 2021

Seminole State College GEAR UP is pleased to announce that we will provide financial assistance for our cohort (sophomore students 2020-21) that will be juniors starting the summer of 2021 for concurrent / dual enrollment course fees. SSC GEAR UP will pay up to \$200 for each three-hour credit course and \$250 for each four-hour credit course. SSC GEAR UP will make payment directly to the college or university attending to be applied to the student's bursar account. SSC GEAR UP will also provide required textbooks to be used during the semester. The books will remain the property of SSC GEAR UP and must be returned at the end of each term/semester.

All concurrent students must have a signed statement from the high school principal or counselor stating that they are eligible to satisfy requirements for graduation from high school (including curricular requirements for college admission) no later than the spring of the senior year and must also provide written permission from a parent or legal guardian.

Students will need to ensure to make the requisite score(s) on the Pre-ACT or ACT /SAT at the institution seeking admission. Scores at a community college must be at least a 19 on the Pre-ACT/ ACT in a core class to take the first year equivalent core classes, while regional universities require a 20 and comprehensive universities require a 24. ### **10th GRADE PARENTS-This is** the LAST OPPORTUNITY for **OKLAHOMA'S PROMISE**

Oklahoma's Promise allows eighth-, ninth-, or tenthgrade students from families with an income of \$55,000 or less to earn a college tuition **scholarship**. Special provisions may apply for children adopted from certain court-ordered custody and children in the custody of court-appointed legal guardians and families receiving Social Security disability or death benefits. Students must also meet academic and conduct requirements in high school. Upon completion of the program's requirements, your student will earn:

- Tuition at an Oklahoma college or university, or
- A portion of tuition at an accredited Oklahoma ٠ private college or university, or
- A portion of tuition for approved programs at an Oklahoma public technology center

SSC GEAR UP summer camp 2021 theme is forensic excavations! Students will dig up and get the full scoop on this growing career field. Forensic science is the process of applying scientific methods to solve mysteries and crimes. Students attending camp will gain valuable skills in examining physical evidence through detailed and critical thinking, administering tests like fingerprinting, interpreting finger print analysis, and developing communication skills.
