Information on Concurrent Enrollment at Seminole State College

April 8, 2020

- Concurrent students must complete an Online Application for Admission to SSC at www.sscok.edu
- SSC waives the tuition costs of up to 18 credit hours for concurrent high school seniors and up to 9 credit hours for juniors. The tuition waiver for juniors is subject to state funding. Concurrent waivers may be used for Fall, Spring and Summer semesters.
- Limited fees are assessed to concurrent students. The Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education do not permit the waiving of fees.
- Concurrent students must have a high school GPA of 3.0 OR have taken the ACT and scored a minimum composite of 19 or 900 on the SAT.
- Upon high school graduation, if a student wishes to continue at SSC, he or she MUST complete a new SSC Admission Application online.
- To continue enrollment at SSC as a high school student, a minimum of 2.0 college GPA must be maintained.
- A student wishing to attend concurrently must submit a [Current Enrollment form](#) signed by the high school principal or counselor, parent/legal guardian, and the student each semester. ***Currently, due to the COVID-19 pandemic, SSC is accepting emails as well as signatures for approvals.***
- A concurrent student must submit an official high school transcript (with high school GPA calculated by high school) and ACT (or SAT) scores.
- Every student should stay aware that collegiate level classes taken and grades received as a high school concurrent student are part of the calculation to determine your financial aid status and eligibility. If a student receives a failing grade or withdraws from classes, he or she potentially becomes ineligible for financial aid when starting college. Should students have struggles arise while enrolled in classes, they should reach out to instructors immediately. Students will receive an email at the end of each semester detailing financial aid's requirements and his or her financial aid status.

Also, know that SSC's Financial Aid, Advising and Admissions teams are always willing to talk with students to determine their current status and discuss future scenarios.
